## Look what the children have been doing!

### Nursery

Our story this week has been Farmer Duck and we have had lots of fun learning about animals that live on the farm.

In maths we have been measuring length and height and we have really impressed our teachers with the mathematical language we have been using whilst playing.

As part of the nursery curriculum we have also been investigating sound by using different instruments. We learnt the names of lots of instruments and talked about how we could make music. Finally, we listened carefully to the instructions and were able to play our instruments to the beat of a nursery rhyme.

### Reception

This week during RE, we shared the story of how Jesus died, discussing the importance of the Cross to Christians. We talked about how the Cross is a sad thing because it reminds of how Jesus died but it is also reminds us of God's love. We created our own crosses.



Our new focus text is Brave Bear and the first thing children have discovered is that the story is set in a very hot place!! We looked at the illustrations and used 'warm' colours (red, orange, yellow) in different mediums to create our own warm pictures



This week's maths lessons have involved consolidating past concepts such as composition of 5 and equal/ unequal quantities. Children have worked well together to complete tasks based on developing prior knowledge.

### **Year 1**

The children in Year 1 have worked incredibly hard this week, taking part in assessments and reviewing all that they have learnt during the spring term. They showed maturity, resilience and dedication when completing their assessments and have made the year 1 teachers and staff very proud. Alongside this, we have continued with our RE learning which looks at the story of Palm Sunday. The children worked collaboratively to create banners as if they were welcoming Jesus to Jerusalem. In PSHE, the children are continuing to learn about healthy eating and making healthy choices to look after themselves and their bodies. This week, they looked at food from around the world and learnt about Vietnamese cuisine. Each child had the opportunity to come up with a recipe for their own Vietnamese spring roll! Next week the children will be focusing on a D&T project involving a Pringle! Watch this space next week!

### **Year 2**

This week the children worked tirelessly to complete their mock SATs. It was so encouraging to see so many children continue to display resilience and determination, as they did their best with this week's exams. Please continue to work on the reading, writing and maths as we prepare for the upcoming KS1 SATs in May. I would like to take this opportunity to also thank all the adults for the support and their contributions towards completing the tests with groups and individuals. A quick reminder, next Monday 18th March 2024, the children will be going to Lee Valley Athletics Centre. Please check that you have given the necessary permissions on ParentPay in order for your child to take part.

### **Year 3**

Year 3 have been busy this week, completing our assessments. The children have worked extremely hard and have shown lots of progress! We have also been writing our own version of 'Hansel and Gretel'. We have some fantastic story writers in Year 3!

Just a reminder – Please do not forget to log into TTRS to compete in the tournament!!! It's great fun and is a fantastic way to develop your multiplication skills!

### **Year 4**

Year 4 has been continuing their learning about trade within the Roman Empire. In Science they learnt about reversible and irreversible changes.

Even though it was Assessment week the children are preparing for their recorder concert with Miss Morgan next week on Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> March at 2.30pm. All Year 4 parents are welcome.



## Year 5

Last week, we celebrated World Book Day and Stem Day. Year 5s took part in a range of fun activities. As part of World Book Day, we completed some art work and we participated in a book talk with Louie Stowell, the author of Loki.

On Stem Day, our theme was Time and we focused on Mary Anning, a palaeontologist. We learnt about adaptation in Science, timelines in Maths and created fact files on Mary Anning, as part of DFR.



This week, we have had a busy one filled with assessments. Well done to all Year5's who tried their best and scored some amazing results! Your hard work really paid off.

## Year 6

It has come to our attention that the majority of children in the Year group have expressed that they do not need to practise the Times Tables Rockstars as they have CGP books to revise from. Could you please strongly encourage ALL children to complete any sessions set on TTRS as times tables knowledge is the fundamental skill that children need to have. They should have RAPID recall of all times tables up to 12 and the inverse operations. Example:  $8 \times 12 = 96$  so  $96 \text{ divided by } 8 = 12$ .

Children should also be reading for a minimum of twenty minutes a night and they should use a thesaurus to look up the meaning of any vocabulary that proves challenging for them.

### Nut free school

Please remember that we are a nut free school. A large number of our children have nut allergies, some of which are very serious and they are even sensitive to airborne microparticles. To ensure everyone is safe please make sure your child does not bring nuts into school. This is especially important if children have brought their own packed lunches on trips and I would urge you to impress upon your child the need for them not to share their food.



## Maintenance payments

As we approach the end of the financial year please make sure that you have paid your maintenance fund payment for this year. The charge is £40 per child every year. Thank you to all of the parents who have paid this to date.
