<u>Trinity</u>

This week the children in Trinity have been looking at The Very Hungry Caterpillar as our focus story. We had lots of fun exploring all the food the caterpillar ate during the week and creating our very own caterpillar. We also used the story to support our understanding of sequencing and the days of the week.

















<u>Nursery</u>

This week the children have been learning about Easter and why we celebrate Easter. The children listened to the Easter story and learnt lots of new words such as disciple, crucifixion and resurrection. The children used stick puppets to retell the story and drew pictures of the story. The children made bread in the builder's tray and understood that Jesus shared the bread and wine with his disciples. They have also been exploring lots of Easter activities, such as painting with carrots, matching eggs in the sand, decorating eggs and making Easter crosses.

In maths, we have been learning about mass and we have been using scales to determine what objects are heavy or light.

Reception

This week for RE the key question was: **What is special about the stone?** Children learned about the resurrection of Jesus and how Christians believe that God raised Jesus from the dead. Children worked together to create a tomb with the stone rolled away, adding a figure to show Jesus standing nearby.

Reception children had a fantastic time on their trip to Lee Valley. They took part in a range of activities including Long Jump and Javelin. Staff were extremely impressed with the children, not only with their participation but also with the way they listened to and followed instructions on the journey. Thank you to all of our parent volunteers and, of course, to Mrs Smitten for organizing the trip.



<u>Year 1</u>

This week the children in year 1 have been working scientifically to ask questions and make predictions. We are currently working on our 'Post a Pringle' project and experimented with different packaging. The children carried out various tasks to support their understanding of different materials and conducting a scientific test. They were able to talk about their predictions and provide explanations. They worked in small groups to discuss and make sense of the results. The children thoroughly enjoyed this task and are looking forward to posting their own Pringle next week!

<u>Year 2</u>

This week Year 2 were tasked to describe a mythological dragon. The children tried extremely hard to experiment with their sentences and use ambitious vocabulary correctly. To create images in the readers' minds, they used literary techniques such as onomatopoeia, alliteration and descriptive language.

The children also practiced their 10x tables. Please continue to work on this at home with your children.

Year 3

Year 3 have immersed themselves in the captivating world of manga by creating their very own '**manga-style' villains**. Their imagination and artistic skills were truly impressive!

In addition to their imaginative creations, the children also presented their FITT projects they had diligently worked on at home. The level of dedication and effort was outstanding!





















<u>Year 4</u>

Year 4 have been using their non-chronological writing skills to write a report on Roman trade. They attempted to use such features as headings, subheadings, captions, diagrams and speaking in the third person.

In maths, they learnt how to recognise equivalent fractions while in Science they investigated reversible and irreversible changes.

4B have won the attendance cup for the second time in a row so thank you parents for bringing your children to school keen and on time.



<u>Year 5</u>

The past week Year 5 have been comparing the lives of rich and poor in all civilisations: Ancient Egypt, Ancient Greece, Ancient Benin, Ancient Rome and the Victorian Era. This has allowed them to see and compare the different lifestyles and compare them to today's world. As part of our Topic on Rich and Poor, we introduced the marble system which has allowed children to experience the worth of marbles and helped them decide how they would like to save and spend.

<u>Year 6</u>

This week the children have been learning all about the events that led up to WW2. They explored the impact that the Blitz had on the United Kingdom and spent time looking at how their local area (Enfield) was impacted during the war. They were amazed to discover that during 'Wings for Victory' week, Southgate raised enough money to buy a Stirling bomber jet.

We are busy revising for SATs and we would encourage all children to do some independent study at home. Most of the children have their CGP books and their are an abundance of revision web-sites that the children can go on. Some areas that they could be encouraged to study for their grammar test are:

- clauses (subordinate and relative)
- verbs
- nouns
- adjectives
- prepositions
- determiners
- punctuation (colon, semi-colon, hyphen, dash)
