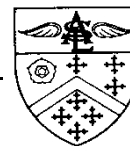

Nursery

In the nursery this week we have had 'Football Fever! We have been busy making football shirts, trophies and playing ball games in the outside area.

We have also been working hard at writing our names and drew some wonderful and imaginative pictures on the white boards. We made pictures with the different shapes and described them talking about the shape and colour.

Finally we had a great time visiting our new Reception classes and meeting our teachers!

The last day of term for the nursery children will be Tuesday 23rd July which will be an Olympic dress up day. Nursery is closed on Wednesday 24th July.





Reception

As children approach the end of their journey in Early Years, they have been making the most of their afternoon child-initiated learning times. During this time children have demonstrated how the skills and knowledge that they have learnt in Reception are now embedded.



Children have chosen to draw and write about their family members, recounting experiences in great detail. Others have used their well-developed vocabulary to create stories using small world resources, such as the dinosaurs. This year we have spent a lot of time discussing the concepts of love and care, and following the example set by Jesus. Children chose to use the baby dolls to demonstrate how to care for them and some children designed and created baby equipment in the craft area.

These are the experiences that children, as well as practitioners will remember as the transition to year1 begins.

Year 1

Along with the rest of the school, Year 1 visited their new class rooms and met their new class teachers this week. They were thrilled upon their return and are excited to start year 2 in September. 1 yellow visited the library and explored all the new books on offer. They got the opportunity to have some downtime after a busy, eventful week and enjoyed some stories together. This week the children read the story of Jamela's dress by Niki Daly and talked about clothes that are special to us. The children drew themselves in their special clothes and wrote about why it is special and how it makes them feel when wearing them. **Just a reminder to return your child's Little Wandle reading book and any other school books they have at home please.**

Year 2

This week, the children had the opportunity to enjoy a captivating orchestral performance by students from Latymer Secondary School. They were immersed in a diverse repertoire of classical and contemporary music, while also learning about various instruments, musical



styles, and terminology. Additionally, the children were treated to an engaging visit from Vicky, who shared insightful teachings on the significance of baptism, marriage, and the importance of keeping one's promises. Through her creative storytelling and personal anecdotes, the children gained a deeper understanding of how these life events have impacted Vicky's life and the guiding role of God in her journey.

Year 3

We are coming to the end of Year 3 have been making their own models of churches. They carefully drew and cut out shapes and used them as a template. Once their pieces were drawn on cardboard, the children constructed their churches. Some added stained glass windows, pillars and even a dome! We can't wait to show you the final product, once they have all been painted.

Year 4

Year 4 have been learning about the ancient kingdom of Benin and some of their ancient rulers in history.

The Year 4 art, included making the Benin bust of the Queen Mother, using pinching, cutting and moulding techniques. Here are some of the results:

Year 6

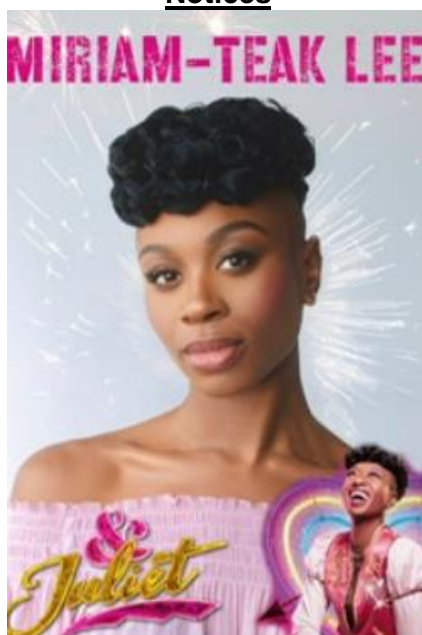
Children in year 6 have been busy finessing and polishing their acts ahead of their 'Talent Show' next week. A letter went out to parents this week about purchasing tickets for the event.
