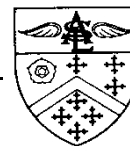

Nursery

This week the nursery children have been very busy practising for Sports Day! They have had lots of fun enjoying the weather safely and looking for insects in the Nursery garden. In the creative area we have been thinking about our designs and selecting our own resources that we need to bring our designs to life!

In maths, the children have been consolidating their learning. They have been counting objects, matching numbers, recognising digits and have been beginning to order numbers to 5.



Reception

This week children worked together to create and solve addition and subtraction stories using a range of objects. Children confidently made correct use of vocabulary such as add, subtract, altogether and equals. During independent choosing time, lots of children have been choosing different resources to demonstrate their phonics skills.



We have started to share a text called 'Ruby's Worry' about a girl who feels sad due to her worries. For Art we linked the feeling of sadness to the colour blue. We enjoyed looking at the artist, Picasso's paintings from his 'Blue Period' and some children created their own blue portraits. We know, however, that blue is not always a sad colour. Ms. Karsa brought some blue Hydrangeas from her garden and we used the same blue colours to paint them.



Year 1

The children have been enjoying the lovely weather this week. They have been playing fun, exciting games outside using our playground equipment. The staff on duty have commented on how well the children have played and conducted themselves during the games and activities. This week the children have also completed their end of year assessments. It has been wonderful to see how much they have progressed over the year. Lastly, our children performed extremely well during sports day. They showed resilience and skill during the task and were great team players. Well done year 1!

As the weather is getting warmer please ensure that your child attend school with a water bottle and sun hat each day. They will be encouraged to keep hydrated throughout the day.

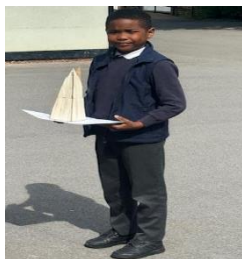
Year 2

Year 4

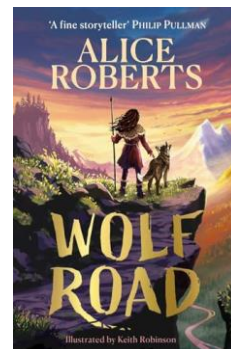
Year 4 have done really well in their Multiplication Government Test. They achieved 77% success rate with 39% of all our children achieving 25/25. This is an improvement by 5% from last year.

Maths assessments so far show a close to 80% success rate. Thank you so much parents for supporting your children.

Year 5

This week, Y5 have had the absolute pleasure to participate in a virtual author visit, hosted by national booksellers: Waterstones. The author, Alice Roberts, is a renown academic who has presented numerous science and history television documentaries on BBC, Sky and Channel 4.

Year 5, and the rest of KS2, were treated to a behind the scenes tour of her research and the background history, a sneak peek at some of the illustrations and an introduction to the protagonist and plot of this most intriguing adventure story. We can't wait to get our hands on a copy!



Year 6

Children in Year 6 attended a sustainability workshop in Hyde Park last week. They had the opportunity to explore the LookOut building and identify sustainable building materials used. They also explored the exterior and grounds of the building and used a tick sheet to locate and identify sustainable features. The highlight of the trip for most children was discovering tiny slots built into the eaves of the building; these were specially designed to house bats.



WhatsApp safety guide for parents

13+ WhatsApp's minimum age in the UK

58% Kids aged 3-17 who use WhatsApp

37% Kids under 13 who use WhatsApp

5 tips to keep kids safe on WhatsApp

- 1 Review privacy settings** WhatsApp has a range of privacy and security settings to keep users safe. Customise groups, app access, live location and more.
- 2 Customise contacts** Show your child how to report and block unwanted contacts. Then, work with them to add their Friends and family. Review and talk about their contacts regularly.
- 3 Talk about personal information** Make sure your child understands what personal information is. Talk about the importance of keeping that information private on WhatsApp.
- 4 Show them where to get support** If something goes wrong or they see something worrying on WhatsApp, make sure they know to come to you, and talk about other sources of support.
- 5 Check in regularly** Once you've done all of the above, check in with them regularly to review settings and how they use WhatsApp.
