Maths: All children have access to Times Tables Rockstars and Purple Mash to practice their number bonds and times tables.

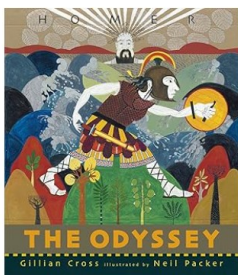
Purple Mash: Your child may also receive homework set by the teachers via Purple Mash.

Homework Project: Your child will also receive a project that they can research during the holiday.

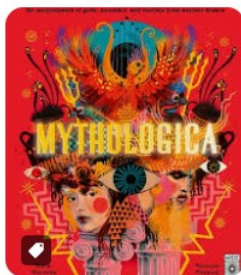
Weekly Homework: Every Friday, the children will have homework

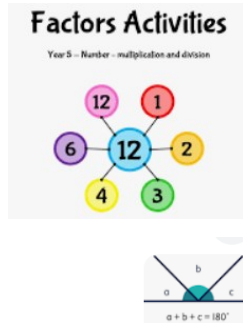

Science

Properties and Change

Conductivity is a measure of how quickly and easily a material will let heat or electrical charge pass through.

Hardness is a measure of how easily a material can be scratched or dented.

Transparency is a measure of how much light a material lets pass through.

English: Reading—Mythologica by Victoria Topping

The children will maintain a positive attitude to reading and understanding what they read by using a range of strategies.

English Writing—The Odyssey

- Using a wide range of devices to build cohesion within and across paragraphs
- Identifying the audience for and purpose of the writing, selecting the appropriate form and using other similar writing as models for their own, noting and developing initial ideas, drawing on reading and research where necessary
- Selecting appropriate grammar and vocabulary, understanding how such choices can change and enhance meaning
- Use further prefixes and suffixes and understand the guidance for adding them including root words
- Use knowledge of morphology and etymology in spelling and understand that the spelling of some words need to be learnt specifically, as listed in English Appendix 1

Design and Technology

Mechanical systems—Pop-up book

Create a functional four-page pop-up storybook design, using lever, sliders, layers and spacers to create paper-based mechanisms.

History
