Home Learning

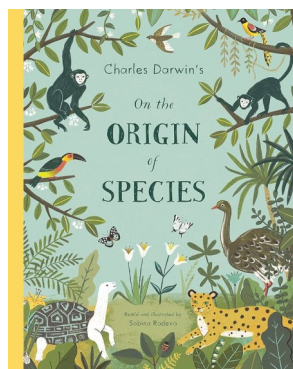
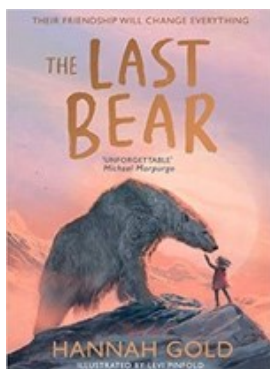
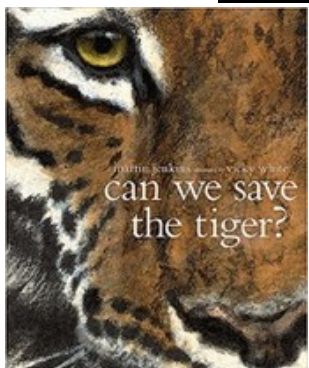
Reading: Children should read for at least 20 minutes each evening and complete their daily reading activities in their home reader.

Music

In music, children in Year 6 will listen and appraise jazz music and other songs in different styles in the genre of Jazz.

In addition to this, the children will take part in weekly singing assemblies.

Maths

In Maths, Year 6 will learn:

- Division
- Fractions
- Measures (different units of measure)
- Weekly arithmetic tests

Science

This term the children will be looking at energy and specifically, light and reflection. The children will explore:

- Different sources of light and how the eye is protected from light
- Use a ray diagrams to look at shadows
- Experiment with mirror reflections

The Big Question?

How is it possible to see light around corners?

History

In our History lessons, children will be studying 'Cradles of Civilisation.' They will look at:

- The land of the two rivers
- Trade, building, writing
- Epic of Gilgamesh
- Similarities between civilisations

Geography

In Geography children will study 'Mountains.' They will learn:

- What mountains are?
- Why people live on mountains
- Living on the Andes

English: Reading

In Year 6 all children take part in Literacy Leaves - Reading comprehension. These sessions concentrate on a different reading skill each day—Word Meaning, Retrieval, Summarising, Inference, Prediction, Identifying Meaning, Understanding Author Choice and Making Comparisons.

English Writing

In Writing lessons, children will explore the different ways to write a variety of effective sentences—both structure and content.

Design & Technology

This term in our D&T lessons the children will design and program a navigation tool to produce a multifunctional device for trekkers, using CAD 3D modelling software.

They will also have the opportunity to pitch and explain the product to a guest panel.
