Nursery

Reception

This week Reception children have been learning about the importance of looking after their teeth.

Year 2








In History, we continue to be historians learning about the differences, similarities and connections between the ancient civilizations of Greece, Rome and Egypt. Our children found out how, much like today, ancient civilisations were dependent upon each other and the growth of their economies by trading a variety of goods with their partners. Did you know that Egypt were the largest producers of the papyrus plant from which they made paper and it was one of their largest exports? They also exported lots of grain grown on the fertile banks of the River Nile.

Year 5

Our marvellous mathematicians have been busy converting fractions to decimals, changing improper to mixed number fractions and studying a thousandth as a fraction.



Last Friday, year 5 had a fantastic morning at Lea Valley Sports Centre. Where they took part in various sporting events The activities, which were led by professional sports coaches included: long jump, hurdles and track racing. The children were complemented on their excellent behaviour and it was a brilliant day!



As part of our topic, Rich and the Poor, children have been discussing the various social issues that we face in society such as: poverty and inequalities, the rising cost of living, why various industries are taking industrial action and much more. This week, children learnt the skill of writing a letter of complaint, including all of the features. Ask your children how many features of a letter of complaint they can remember!













Year 6

In RE this week we looked at the Stations of the Cross and how they link to the concepts of forgiveness, salvation and hope. We spent time discussing the following question: "How does Jesus' journey to the cross, offer signs of hope?" It would be nice if you could spend some time exploring this question with your child.

We have continued to look at World War 2 in our topic lessons and the children wrote a very convincing diary entry for Anne Frank. They wrote about what life was like for her on a daily basis, reflecting on the persecution and oppression that Jews faced in occupied countries during the war.

Our maths lessons are all based on revision and reinforcing key concepts that children have studied in KS2. We looked at time and time word problems; translating shapes; angles and area, perimeter and volume.
