Nursery

The Nursery children have had a very busy week learning all about ladybirds! Our story this week has been 'What the ladybird heard!'

We have been learning about story settings and the children have created some wonderful maps of the farm! They have used pictures to sequence and retell the story. The children have also counted spots on ladybirds and have gone on a ladybird hunt as one was spotted earlier on in the week. We had great fun looking for ladybirds. Finally, we listened to other stories about ladybirds.















Reception

This week we continued looking at our book, 'No dinner!' which is set in India. We will be learning some information about India and we have already learned about an impressive building called the Taj Mahal . Children made models of Taj Mahal using blocks and drew some amazing, detailed pictures.





For RE our key question was: "How did Jesus rescue people who were lonely?" We discussed the bible story of Zacchaeus and children drew some fantastic picttures. We also role played incidents where children have no friends to play with and discussed how this feels and what we can do about it.





This week the sun was shining and it was very warm. Please ensure that children are wearing sun cream and have a sun hat labelled with their name. Children also need a water bottle in school.

<u>Year 1</u>

This week in RE, the children have continued their study of Islam by looking at the importance of the Qur'an and why it is special to Muslims. They used their prior knowledge of other faiths to make comparisons. The children are continuing to practise their writing in English; using their imagination and mind map created to recount our story. In Science, the children have been learning how to stay safe in the sun. They created a Sun safety poster. In Music, the children started learning how to play the African djembe drum and dance. Last week Friday, the children had the opportunity to try different skipping skills led by professional coaches. They had an amazing time.

Year 2

This week the children had the opportunity to travel to central London. We went to Bishopsgate near Liverpool Street. It was a wonderful day as we were blessed with glorious weather. The children enjoyed seeing the modern skyscrapers contrasted against the older buildings from the 1800s. Some of which were damaged and restored during the Great Fire of London. The children were exceptionally well behaved throughout the journey and other



commuters commented on how well the children represented our school. Well done Year 2 for being brilliant role-models and keep this up for our upcoming trips.

Year 3

This term in Year 3, our topic is 'Buildings'. The children presented their FITT Projects to the class and made themselves extremely proud by sharing all of the interesting facts that they had researched during the half-term break. Thank you to all of the wonderful parents and carers who have been supporting the children with completing these.

Also, Year 3 really enjoyed our trip to Lee Valley and have some brilliant athletes! I'm sure you will see them taking part in the 2032 Olympic Games! Watch this space!



Year 4

This week has been a busy week in year 4. In science, we have just set up an investigation to mimic the effect of different liquids on teeth. We have placed an egg in a cup of vinegar, water, cola and orange juice and we will observe what happens to the egg shells over a period of time and then link this



back to what may happen to our own teeth. I am sure that if you ask the children to share their observations they would love to tell you what's happening to the egg shells.
















In topic, we have been learning about different artists and creating visual diaries as a way to record important facts about them. Here are a couple about Picasso.



Year 5

Last week, Year 5 had the pleasure of visiting Lee valley athletics centre where they ran a relay, practised the long jump and worked on their javelin skills. It was wonderful to see them enjoying all those sports in a such an amazing setting. They even had the opportunity to listen to and ask questions of a professional athlete who not only trains at Lee Valley Athletics Centre but who has won a number of medals and trophies throughout his athletic career. Hearing about his journey was truly inspiring.



Year 6

Children have been learning all about Algebra in their maths lessons this week. We spent time looking at the following:



- Using simple formulae
- Generating and describing linear number sequences
- Expressing missing number problems algebraically

Why not get your child to explain how the would solve the following problem. Simplify the expression - 3y + 4 + 2y.

In our topic lessons we have spent time looking at how litter and plastic can harm our environment. We investigated how harmful plastic can be to animals and discussed how most plastic that we use in our everyday lives is not biodegradable.

Our RE lesson was centred around rules and we looked at the question: What rules do we have to follow and why we have rules? At the end of the lesson the children spent some time reflecting about what questions they had about life and rules for living.

RE Day 2023 – Prayer

On the last day before breaking up for the half term holiday, we held an RE Day across the whole school. The focus for the day was prayer and looking at the different ways in which people pray, depending on their beliefs and experiences. Children looked at the ways in which people prayer across the major world religions, and many children and adults were able to bring and share their own personal experiences. This led to a rich and engaging day of communication –speaking, listening, contemplating and reflecting.

From the youngest to the oldest the children explored different levels of enquiry: What is Prayer? Why is Prayer important? AND How should our lives reflect the Prayers we pray? Considering the Tibetan tradition of Prayer flags in the Buddhist Faith, children wrote their own prayers to be hung up around the school as a reminder of the prayers we pray and the things we pray for.



The PRAYER SPACE, set up in the Junior Hall, was an interactive activity that all children experienced. Here they could engage with prayer in a whole range of creative ways: Being Silent and Still. Thinking about the School Family of which we are all a part. Considering our uniqueness. Reflecting on the things we are sorry for. Contemplating BIG Questions we can ask God. Remembering the things and loved ones we no longer have with us. Looking at our Hopes & Dreams for the Future – Small, Bigger and Huge. Considering people in need – The News. Challenging ourselves with Forgiveness.

For some, prayer

is a daily part of life, for others the day would have opened their understanding to the subject of prayer in new ways. Prayer draws people closer to God and brings comfort, peace and hope. The day was a valuable experience in many different ways.

Summer is here!

Keep your children Safe in the Sun.

Put on sunscreen (minimum, SPF30 or SPF50 with at least 4* UVA protection rating), at least 30 minutes before your child goes outside. Re-apply every 2 hours, and after swimming, even it states that the sunscreen is water resistant. Pay particular attention so that hands, feet, cheeks, nose, ears, shoulders and back of the neck are covered. Do check that the sunscreen is not past its expiry date.

- Put on loose, long sleeve clothing.
- Wear a wide brimmed hat.
- Wear sunglasses with adequate UV protection (look for the CE or UKCA mark).
- Find shady areas to play, especially between 11am-3pm.
- Keep hydrated and drink plenty of water.



Keep Babies under 6 months of age out of direct sunlight.
