Nursery

We have been continuing the story of 'Biscuit Bear' and the children have been exploring shadows, making shapes and animals with their hands. We also discovered the buzz and excitement of a circus. We practised circus skills such as spinning plates, balancing and juggling.

In maths, the children have been learning about the number 2. They have been sorting 1 and 2 objects and matching with the numeral. We have decorated the numeral and have been practising subitising on the carpet.









Reception


This week as part of our maths lesson we sorted 2D shapes. Children used the correct names for different shapes and key vocabulary such as straight, curved, side and corners. Children went on to create pictures using 2D shapes.

We continued to share our focus book, Blue Penguin, discussing how the main character felt when the other penguins excluded him because he was blue. We discussed the importance of being kind to others.





We have been thinking about the animals in the Antarctic, where blue Penguin lived. We used our senses to explore blocks of ice and found animals hidden





Our RE question this week was: How Do Christians Prepare For Christmas Day? We talked about Advent, the time leading up to Christmas and used our handprints to make a beautiful advent wreath.

Year 1













This week, Year 1 looked at shadows as part of their Science topic. The children will be given the opportunity to go outside and explore shadows whenever it is sunny. They looked at what happens when an object is close to or further away from a source of light. In RE, children looked at the importance of Mary and Joseph in the Nativity story and why they were chosen to be the parents of Jesus. They designed 'Wanted Posters' for who will be Jesus' parents.

The children started their end of term assessment this week which will continue into next week.

Year 2

This week, the children started to complete their Autumn term assessments. This was a great opportunity for the children to develop a deeper understanding of the KS1 expectations, the administration and the process. It is also a chance to identify their areas of strength and weakness to practice over the coming months as we support/guide the children to meet the National Key Stage 1 Assessment Expectations. Completing the weekly homework and Home-reader questions consistently, will enable your child to do this, as they will be more confident with their strategies.

Please talk to your children about how they found the tests this week and any potential challenges they faced.

Year 3

What happens when you shine light onto opaque objects? How are shadows formed? How can you change the size of a shadow? These are just some of the questions which year 3 investigated in their science lessons this week!

We also had a P.E session with a coach from Spurs! The children (and teachers) had a fantastic time and learned so many new skills!

























Year 4

Year 4 promoted this week's Road Safety focus and assisted the teacher in assembly by wearing and showing the importance of high viz jackets when travelling. We discussed the importance of walking safely on the streets and being aware of the meaning of some road signs especially if they like to ride bicycles on the pavement.





Other children in Year 4 celebrated their brilliance at learning their times tables using Times Table Rock Star and achieving their due reward. Well done!



Year 5

As part of our Science topic 'Properties and changes of materials', Year 5s worked on separating mixtures using different methods (evaporation, magnetic attraction, filtration and sieving). The children predicted which method would work best to separate sand and water, salt and water, raising and flour, paper clips and rice. They then tested to see which method worked best.

















Year 6

This week in RE we looked at the Gospels and where Christians get their ideas from about the significance and true meaning of Christmas. They discussed the different accounts of the Christmas story in each Gospel reading to understand how they all had one central theme: that Jesus came to save and bring peace to the world.

In Science this week we constructed some series and parallel circuits. The children investigated how voltage affects the brightness of a bulb.

Our maths lessons this week focused on adding and subtracting fractions.

Next week is assessment week and children will be sitting the following tests:

Monday - Reading assessment
Arithmetic
Tuesday- Grammar and Spelling
Maths reasoning paper 1
Wednesday- Maths reasoning paper 2
