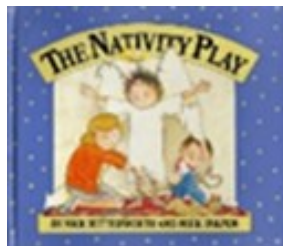
Phonics: Practise the Nursery Rhymes on Tapestry and helping you child to hear the sounds satpin in words.

Literacy

In **Nursery** the children will

-Have real life writing experiences such as shopping lists, invitations and memos.

–Begin to recognise their name on their coat peg and begin to copy letters from their names with support.

-Begin to Understand the five key concepts about print: - meaning,, parts of a book, different purpose of print, page sequencing and text is read from left to right top to bottom.

Mathematics

In Mathematics , **Nursery Children** will learn about

Recognising similarities and differences in groups of objects to help us sort.

Exploring and understanding number 1 and 2—including counting, subitising and recognising digits.

Pattern - Continuing AB patterns using colours, shapes, nature and movement

Singing number songs



Communication and Language

Children use language both at nursery and at home. Children should be encouraged to talk about experiences that are familiar to them and their likes and dislikes.

They will be learning to express their needs, answering questions, listening to and following simple instructions. Children will be encouraged to join in with group activities such as singing and retelling stories. The adults in Nursery will model the use of simple language, questions and routines.

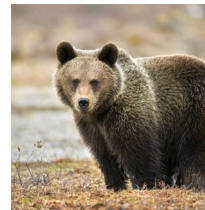

Our **AUTUMN 2** Topic is:

Brilliant Bears

Through our core books the nursery children will be learning all about bears, their habitats and why and how they hibernate.



Physical Development

In **Nursery** we use fine motor skills to do things independently, such as attempting mark making, buttons, zips, scissors and manipulating play dough. We use gross motor skills to clap, stamp, balance and move in different ways..

Becoming independent whilst using the toilet, feeding themselves and getting dressed undressed.

Begins to recognise danger and seeks the support and comfort of significant adults

Understanding the World

In Nursery we will be celebrating lots of different festivals and events this half term.

Bonfire Night, Diwali, Black History Month, Remembrance Day and Christmas.

We will be looking at Non-fiction books about bears and talking about why some animals hibernate.

We will be looking at Circus skills and learning lots of new skills.

Expressive Arts and Design

In the arts, Nursery children will

-Use a variety of materials including pens, pencils, charcoal and pastel and circles

-Handle and manipulate playdough / collage / sensory experiences.

Colour – paint, pencils, / using and naming primary colours / Mixing colours / make marks and give meaning.

-Construction

-Sing rhymes and clap to a beat

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

This half-term Nursery children will begin to

-develop their sense of responsibility and membership of a community.

-Show more confidence in new social situations and select and use activities and resources .

-Talk about their feelings using words like 'happy', 'sad', 'angry' or 'worried'.

-Develop friendships with other children.

-Develop understanding and the importance of rules
