# Home Learning


**Reading:** Children should complete their daily reading and parent/carer should comment and sign.

## English: Reading

## **English Writing**

In Writing lessons, the children are learning how to build basic sentences and how to use the proper punctuation (capital letters and full stops) and grammar. They begin with simple sequencing, and story retelling tasks.

#### <u>Maths</u>

In Maths, the children learn about place value within 10, specifically tens and ones. They learn counting forwards and backwards, and how to count on from any number. They also focus on simple arithmetic of addition and subtraction.

#### Science

In Science lessons, children will be learning about the main curriculum objective of seasonal changes, where they will look into the basic structures of a plant (flower)

## History / Geography

In our Humanities lessons, children will be learning about The geographical differences and similarities between two places, looking into key physical features of different places and countries.

#### Music, Art & DT

In DT the children will begin to explore different cooking skills as they make a variety of recipes that are inspired from the topic related books.

In Art, the children will use vegetables to create prints of different shapes and sizes. Children will also use rice, lentils and pasta to create
