Home Learning

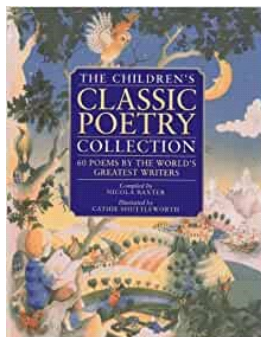
Reading: Children should complete their daily reading and complete their homereader.

English: Reading

In Year 2, we will be continuing to develop and extend our phonics knowledge and strategies for decoding. We will explore different genres of books, fiction, non-fiction and poetry. The focus will be to develop comprehension skills i.e. understanding the meaning behind the written words.

English Writing

Our writing will centre around the topic of 'Express Yourself'. We will be looking at the unique elements that make us who we are, and what makes us special individuals. Exploring a range of writing genres such as auto-biographies and poetry.

Maths

Our focus in maths this term is - Place Value.

The children will learn the value of each digit in a number up to 100 and partition numbers into hundreds, tens and ones. They will look at how these factor together to create bigger numbers.

As the term progresses, we will apply our learning to Addition and Subtraction.

Science

In Science lessons, the children will be learning all about plants. We will be identifying a variety of common wild and domestic garden plants. We will also be describing the basic structures of common plants, including trees.

We will use our local environment throughout the year to explore and answer questions about plants growing in our natural habitat.

History / Geography

We will be discussing our heritage and the different nationalities within our school, our similarities and differences and the importance of our past.
