Home Learning

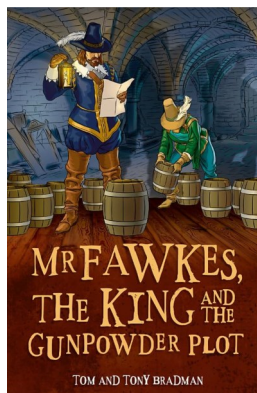
Reading: Children should complete their daily reading and complete their homereader.

English: Reading

In Year 2, we will be continuing to develop our phonics knowledge and exploring different genres of books, both fiction and non-fiction. The focus will be to develop comprehension skills.

English Writing

In Writing lessons, we will be entering our topic of 'Great and Ghastly'. We will be looking at some famous historical events that took place in London such as The Great Fire of London and the Gunpowder Plot. Children will write recounts and poetry inspired by all they have learned.

Maths

In Maths, Year 2 will continue to learn addition and subtraction skills.

We will begin by exploring our number bonds to 10 and 20. Children will work towards being able to add and subtract two 2 digit numbers, crossing 10.

We will then move onto looking at shapes. Children will explore the properties of both 2D and 3D shapes.

Science

In Science lessons, children will be learning all about materials.

We will be identifying and comparing the suitability of a variety of everyday materials, including wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick, rock, paper and cardboard for particular uses.

We will also find out how the shapes of solid objects made from some materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching.

History / Geography

In history we will be looking at some famous historical events that took place in London such as The Great Fire of London and the Gunpowder Plot, examining how these events of the past have shaped our future.

In geography we will compare London from past to present, looking at architectural changes to our city.

Music, Art & DT

This half term is full of amazing creative experiences working with a wide range of materials.

Things to look forward to:

- Firework paintings inspired by the work of Andy Goldworthy.
- Using a range of instruments to imitate the thrill of a firework display.

PSHCE
