English: Reading

In Year 2, we will be continuing to develop our phonics knowledge and exploring different genres of books, both fiction and non-fiction. The focus will be to develop comprehension skills.

English Writing

In Writing lessons, we will be entering our topic of 'Great and Ghastly'. We will be looking at some famous historical figures such as Florence Nightingale and Neil Armstrong. Children will reflect back on the skills learned in Autumn 1, to write biographies inspired by these great people.

<u>Maths</u>

In Maths, Year 2 will continue to learn addition and subtraction skills.

We will begin by exploring our number bonds to 10 and 20. Children will work towards being able to add and subtract two 2 digit numbers, crossing 10.

We will then move onto looking at shapes. Children will explore the properties of both 2D and 3D shapes.

Science

In Science lessons, children will be learning all about materials.

We will be identifying and comparing the suitability of a variety of everyday materials, including wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick, rock, paper and cardboard for particular uses.

We will also find out how the shapes of solid objects made from some materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching.

History / Geography

In History, we will be looking at some famous historical events that took place around the world over the last 500 years, such as The Battle of Trafalgar, The Crimean War and The Moon Landing in 1969, examining how these events of the past have shaped our future.



Music, Art & DT

This half term is full of amazing creative experiences working with a wide range of materials.

PSHE

This half-term, children will looking at our role as individuals within our school and wider community.
