Home Learning


Reading: Children should read for at least 20 minutes each evening and complete their daily reading activities in their home reader.

English: Reading

In Year 6 all children take part in Daily Focused Reading (DFR). These sessions concentrate on a different reading skill each day—Word Meaning, Retrieval, Summarising, Inference, Prediction, Identifying Meaning, Understanding Author Choice and Making Comparisons.

English Writing

In Writing lessons, children will explore how to interweave speech into a piece of narrative writing. They will also experiment with using descriptive language - similes, metaphors and personification.

History / Geography

In our Humanities lessons, children will be learning about:.

- Life in Britain before, during and after Roman invasion
- Battles of the Anglo Saxon kingdoms and their kings
- Viking raids and invasion of Britain
- British political changes over time

Maths

In Maths, Year 6 will learn:

- Ratio- (using ratio language, ratio symbols, scale drawings, scale factors)
- Algebra -(forming expressions and equations, solving one and two step equations)
- Decimals- (rounding, adding and subtracting, divide and multiply by 10.100 and 1000)

Science

In Science lessons, children will be learning about the circulatory system: How oxygen and nutrients are carried around our bodies, and the effects of exercise.
