Reception

This week is Children's mental health week. Miss Elie visited us one afternoon to work on a lovely activity, creating paper 'worry' planes.

Children have been enjoying demonstrating an array of skills in the outside learning area, including balance, coordination, number and writing skills




For maths we have been working on length and height, using mathematical vocabulary to compare objects. For RE we looked at how the church cares for God's special world, thinking about harvest festival food collections and food banks for those in need.

Year 1 have had a busy half term learning about the weather, making wind vanes and storm this as a stimulus for some descriptive writing. They have made great progress with their phonics and will continue to build on their knowledge of phase 5 sounds next half term.

This week the children have worked hard to practise their addition and subtraction skills to 20. Their focus has been to find efficient ways to understand calculation using the number facts



that they know. Next term, we will continue to build on these skills in more depth. All the pupils in year 1 have received a copy of the CGP Phonics book. Please focus on completing the marked pages for the week and return to school at the end of the week.



<u>Year 2</u>

This week the children had the opportunity to take part in the Spelling Bee competition. It was a hard fought contest and all the children who took part did extremely well. Well done to the following pupils: Mackenzie 2R Zachary 2Y Ambrose 2R Neel 2B Aaron 2Y All showed great resilience, dedication and confidence as they took part in the challenge.

Year 3

We have been sewing semaphore flags this week in Year 3. The semaphore flag system uses two short poles with square flags, which a signal person holds in different positions to signal letters of the alphabet and numbers.

Red and yellow flags are used at sea, while blue and white flags are used on land. Sewing the flags, using the backstitch, was very challenging for us however we pushed through!



Year 4

Year 4 have been continuing their learning about perimeter in maths and states of matter in Science.

However, we have also been focusing on Mental Health with the theme: My Voice Matters. The children voted for ideas to be put to the Head teacher to help us improve our school. The children will present them through the school council for her consideration.



Furthermore, Year 4 participated in our Spelling Bee competition and we had six champions.


