English: Reading

The children will be taking part in daily reading groups using the Little Wandle scheme for reading. They will also take part in daily phonics sessions lasting atl east 30 mins. During this session they will practice new sounds and words as well as reviewing old ones.

Our text for this half term is The Jolly Postman or Other Peoples Letters. The story centres around a postman on his daily travels meeting well known characters from traditional tales.

<u>Maths</u>

In Maths the children will be moving on to understanding numbers up to 50. they will be looking at partitioning these numbers into tens and ones and plotting them on a number line. They will do various number line activities with numbers up to 50 including, finding the mid point and counting forwards and backwards.

Later they will calculate using numbers up to 50 as well as exploring length and height in non standard units.

Science

This half term our focus will be on plants. The children will learn to name a variety of plants and understand the different parts of the plant.

The children will have the opportunity to explore our local school area to find leaves and identify different trees. They will learn the difference between deciduous and evergreen trees.

History / Geography

The children will learn about the history of the postal service and how people sent and received messages in the past. They will explore how this has evolved over time.

They will look at the post office, stamps, post boxes and the cyphers on them and how they closely relate to the monarchs in power at the time. The children will look at the first stamp ever made; the Penny Black and look at how stamps have changed in the years.

Our Spring 2 Topic is:

Post a Pringle



Music, Art & DT

In D&T ,the children will learn to master practical skills using a variety of resources. They will explore and demonstrate how to post a Pringle without it breaking in the post. This will give the children the opportunity to test different materials and select ones they think will work best for their design.

Children will also carry out leaf art for a world book day activity using a variety of art mediums including charcoal and oil pastels.

PSHCE

Children will be taking part in the 'Eat Them to Defeat Them Challenge' and will be learning about healthy eating during our PSHE lessons.

They will explore food from a different region of the world each week and find out how it is cooked and prepared for consumption. They will also look at different food groups and understand how the nutrients in the these foods can help to fuel their bodies.

Computing and Digital Learning

In computing the children will be learning to follow instructions and understand basic algorithms. They will practice this one the various games and tasks laid out in Purple Mash which are also accessible from home.

The children will follow simple maps and guide bots around them using key vocabulary like 'left', 'right', 'up', 'down', 'across'.

<u>RE</u>

At the start of the term, the children will explore the story of Noah and how he taught people about hope and forgiveness. This will lead onto understanding the story of palm Sunday and the events of Good Friday and Easter Sunday. The children will explore these stories with lots of discussions and role play.

They will end the term with an RE Day at school and a church service to celebrate Easter.
