English: Reading

The children will be taking part in daily reading groups using the Little Wandle scheme for reading. They will also take part in daily phonics sessions lasting at least 30 mins. During this session they will practice new sounds and words as well as reviewing old ones.

Our text for this half term is 'The Wind Blew' By Pat Hutchins. This simple book tells the story of a windy day in a village and how it affected all the people that lived there.

Maths

In Maths the children will be consolidating their understanding of numbers up to 20. They will use place value counters, base 10, tens frames and Numicon to partition numbers and talk about tens and ones.

They will also be looking closely at the number line up to 20 and using this to help them with addition and subtraction. The children will be taught to use skills such as counting on forwards and backwards.

Science

In our science lessons the children will be learning all about animals. Firstly they will learn to name common animals and then work together to categorise them into different groups.

They will learn about the 6 basic animal groups and sort animals into them. Next they will be looking at animal diets and learning about carnivores, omnivores and herbivores.

History / Geography

Children will investigate places. They will name, locate and identify characteristics of the four countries and capital cities of the United Kingdom and its surrounding seas. They will locate the continents of the world and the oceans. They will look at different extreme weather conditions like flood, tornado, use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to key physical features, including: beach, cliff, coast, forest, hill, mountain, sea, ocean, river, soil, valley, vegetation, season and weather.

Our Spring 1 Topic is:

Extreme weather



Music, Art & DT

In Music, children will explore instrumental sounds for different weather conditions. Look at different percussion instruments and discuss suitability for storm sounds and other weather sounds. They will learn

In D&T, they will master practical skills by demonstrate a range of cutting and shaping techniques (such as tearing, cutting, folding and curling).

PSHCE

The topic will be to show gratitude to those that we love. The children will complete various tasks and activities that teach them about this important value and how they can incorporate it in their daily lives.

Children will be given the opportunity to create cards for those that they are thankful to.

Computing and Digital Learning

In computing the children will be learning to follow instructions and understand basic algorithms. They will practice this one the various games and tasks laid out in Purple Mash which are also accessible from home.

The children will take part lots of group and paired work using Lego to build basic models and then give instructions to their partners to build the same object without looking at theirs. This is to highlight the importance of listening to and following instructions.

RE

In Re the children will be finding out about the Jewish faith. They will spend time looking at objects that are important to the Jewish faith and naming them. They will move on to looking at the Torah and how Jews use it in their daily lives. We will watch videos to see the inside of a synagogue and find out how Jews pray.

Lastly we will be looking at the different days that Jew recognise and celebrate as part of their faith.
